REFERENCES AND GENERAL NOTES

29.1. The last appearance of the second officina. It is worth noting the imaginative suggestion once made by Henry Weller that the reverse stands for ΧΡΙCΤΟC ΝΙΚΕ three times repeated, even if this is unlikely.

29.5. The last Constantinople half follis.

Syracuse.

The folles with single figures on both obverse and reverse (D. O. Class 1) are hard to distinguish from those of Leo III. Here (29.6-7), the legend on the right of the obverse, usually ΝΕΟV, is read as the scarcer variant ΔΕCΠ. The attribution of the first coin seems sound as the figure on the reverse is

bearded. It is possible that the second belongs to Leo III. See D. O., Volume 3, Part 1, p. 311, footnote to 18.1.

29.10. Delicate style. The obverse legends are entirely off-flan.

29.11. The precise form of a supposed exergual legend on the obverse, and its meaning, are uncertain. See D. O. Volume 3, Part 1, p. 314, footnote to no. 20.
